- conclusions of our project (75-100 words)
- summary of the process (100-125 words)
- answers to the DOK questions presented in digital format (creativity encouraged)
- bibliography for research (8-15 sources)
- photographs taken interviews in the community (40-50 photographs)
- a digital mosaic representing conclusions of Enquiry Question including:
